#### **4. Linkage of Outcomes Assessment with Strategic Planning**

Strategic planning is a systematic process to determine the long-term outcomes we want to achieve and how we will measure the results. Common elements and flow to a strategic planning process involve reaffirming the organization or team's mission, values and vision. Rounds of review, brainstorming and action planning go into formulating a strategy and embedding it with milestones to review progress. At these milestones, evaluation and analysis enable review of activity, where data-informed decision-making charts the best path forward for each strategic initiative.

Goals of assessment include to:

- Exhibit accountability for continuous improvement as an institution
- Assess whether students are developing the knowledge, skills and competencies expected of graduates
- Create a culture of data-informed inquiry

Once a plan is set, data is collected through existing or created methods and instruments. Analysis, reporting and meaning-making occur with relevant parties to take action on the results. Taking action includes making changes in hopes of improving student learning, as well as sharing information with relevant audiences.

Assessment and strategic planning are concerned with answering the following questions:

- What does success/achievement look like?
- How (and when) will we know we achieve our intentions?
- What have we learned that we can use to improve in the future?

The foundation of strategic planning is purpose and formulation of the plan for implementation. Alignment is crucial in both activities, where the strategic plan maintains a vertical relationship among strategic elements, and assessment crucially leverages outcomes with respect to differentiated learning—both in terms of frameworks (such as Bloom's Taxonomy) and organizationally (within the department, division and institution).

Learning outcomes become a common language for faculty and staff to communicate across the institution as they work toward serving students' best interests.
