3. **QS World University Ranking** were announced on 19 June 2025, and the University was ranked in the band of 951-1000, which has increased from 1001-2000 in 2024.

4. **MoUs:** Six MoUs were signed during the period April-June 2025, as per the details given below:

- (d) MoA with Temple University, Philadelphia on 19th May 2025, for Dual Master's Degree Programme (Master of Science)
- (e) The University signed MoU with M/S Amstersun I-Tech Pvt. Ltd. (AITPL), with the aim to strengthen the startup ecosystem and work closely with the young early-stage startups launched by the students and faculty on 23rd May

- (f) On 12th June, signed an MoU with the Consortium of Accredited Healthcare Organizations (CAHO), with an aim to foster a strong industry-academia partnership by leveraging collective expertise, resources, and innovations to propel breakthroughs in the healthcare sector.

6. **Alumni Meet:** The University conducted two Alumni international meets during this period.
- (a) 04th Amity North American Alumni Meet on the theme “Coming Home: A Journey Where It All Began” was organized on 13th & 14th May 2025 at Madison, New Jersey, USA on Hybrid Mode.
 - (b) Amity University Alumni Meet 2025 – California, USA to celebrate Legacy, Global Impact, and the Eternal Amity Bond conducted on 20th May 2025. Amity University Alumni gathered in the vibrant city of Fremont, California both in person and virtually to share achievements remembering transformative journeys and strengthening the spirit of belongingness. Honorable Founder President Dr Ashok K. Chauhan was also virtually present.
7. **Student events:**
- (a) Technovate-2025, the prestigious Annual Engineering Project & Poster Presentation “Technovate-2025” was organized by Amity School of Engineering and Technology (ASET), on 21st- 22 May 2025. Over 350 Projects and Posters were displayed during the two-day event, showcasing the creativity, technical skills and innovative ideas of engineering students.
 - (b) Amity School of Architecture and Planning, Noida, organised “RECA+P 2.0” showcasing students’ creative projects on 27th May 2025.
 - (c) The University organized "Yoga Samavesh" (Satellite Programme) in collaboration with Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY), Ministry of AYUSH, as part of the grand celebration of International Day of Yoga (IDY) – 21 June 2025.
 - (d) Two-week Summer School Programme was held from 10 June 2025 for students of 10-12 standard. Over 200 students from 115 schools across India and abroad participate in the Programme.
 - (e) Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship Programme (USRF-2025) commenced at Amity on 12th June 2025.

8. AIU National Vice Chancellors Conference:

The 99th AIU Annual General Meet and two-day National Conference of Vice-Chancellors 2025 (NCVC-2025) was organized by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and hosted by AUUP from 23rd to 24th June, 2025 on the theme for NCVC-2025 was “**Envisioning the Future of Higher Education – The Pivotal Role of India**”.

The NCVC-2024 comprised a total of twenty sessions including a Pre-Inaugural and Inaugural Session, Interface with the Heads of Apex Bodies, Interaction with International bodies, Promotion of AIU Centenary/Platinum/Diamond Partners, a special session on Promoting Nationalism in Higher Education Institutions, two Plenary Sessions, ten Parallel Tracks, and the Valedictory Session.

More than 300 Vice-Chancellors of Universities and other dignitaries attended the conference in a hybrid mode (both physical and online), including Indian and foreign delegates to make this conference a grand success on the completion of 100 glorious years of service to the nation by AIU.

Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, Vice-President of India, inaugurated the conference and planted saplings.

Item No. (UIQAC) 29.02: To review last year's status and approve the Annual Academic Planning for the academic year 2025-26

The Annual Academic Planning (AAP) is an important activity which needs to be done meticulously at the beginning of the academic year.

While conducting review of annual progress for the year 2024-25 and planning for the Academic Year 2025-26, the Head of all institutions have addressed the requirements of rankings, regulatory bodies and enhance University reputation and aligning University targets & goals with the vision of Viksit Bharat@2047.

The AAP 2025-2026 was carried out as per the following details:

- (a) **Institution/Department Level:** Institutional IQAC Chaired by HoI had finalized Institutional annual activities/Plans, the individual faculty targets, and Institutional targets. Department / Centre Committees Chaired by Head of Dept. /Centre /Chairperson of relevant committee (e.g., Administration, Examinations, QAE, Hostels etc). Institutional IQAC uploaded their final annual plans on Amizone (AAP portal) as per the formats online.
- (b) **Domain Level:** Based on inputs from Institutional IQAC, the Chairs of Domain IQAC reviewed of Annual Plan of 2024-25 and discussed the AAP 2025-2026 during the IQAC meetings. A. Review last year's status of AAP 2024-2025

1. **Curricular Aspects**

Dr S K Khatri, Addl Pro Vice Chancellor and Dean (Academics) presented the review of curricular Aspects of the year 2024-2025:

- (a) All the existing programmes were reviewed based on the admission status in last four years and the list of programmes discontinued are enclosed as Annexure "29.02 (B) (Page No.s 4 to 5)".
- (b) **Introduction of New Programmes in Academic Year 2024-25:** In order to keep the pace with the ongoing changes in the industry and bridging the Industry-Academia gaps, 21 New Programmes in 14 Institutions of AUUP were introduced for the Academic Session 2024-25 as per the attached list Annexure "29.02 (C)" (Page No.s 6 to 8)".

- (c) **The Model Frameworks were reviewed and based on** norms of UGC’s CCFUP, any other statutory/regulatory body and Industry demands, 16 Model Frameworks of 158 programmes were modified for implementation in academic year 2024-25. The details are attached as Annexure “29.02 (D)” (Page No.s 9 to 10)”.
- (d) **Based on the revision of the MFWs accordingly the Review of Programme Structure at Institute level through PROAC, CRC, AAB, BoS was recommended.** The programme Structures of 158 programmes of 19 Institutions underwent revision on the recommendations of Board of Studies (BoS) for the Academic Session 2024-25
- (e) **The Institution level PROACs and CRCs were conducted for introducing new courses and review of existing courses.** 477 new courses were introduced during the Academic Year 2024-25. To further reduce classroom teaching hours/load for the students in order to provide with ample time during the working day and engage them in educationally purposeful activities to develop and hone their innovative/creativity, 5055 courses offered in 2024-25 were revised and the concept of Integrated assignment was introduced and implemented

The committee met four times during the year and reviewed 117 proposals of which 92 were recommended.

4. **Infrastructure and Manpower review 2024-25**

4.1 **Infrastructure:** The domain wise infrastructure requirements at the beginning of the academic year 2024-2025 were reviewed by the committee. The shortage in classrooms was managed by sharing the resources. Due to the construction work and shifting of Institutions, the infrastructure requirements were reviewed accordingly. The details are attached as Annexure “29.02 (F) (Page No.s 13 to 14)”.

4.2 **Manpower:** The recruitment of faculty and staff are continuously, and the manpower planning has been prepared for 2025-2026 after having meetings with Deans and Head of the Institutions,

The University IQAC took note of the above.

5. **Research planning review 2024-25**

- (a) Research planning committee led by Dr. W. Selvamurthy and Co-Chaired by Addl Pro Vice Chancellor Dr Chanderdeep Tandon includes various members focused on enhancing research output.
- (b) Key areas include research publications, conference presentations, projects, patents, copyrights, and corporate training.
- (c) The summary of achievements are given below (details of the same are attached as Annexure)
- (d) Projects: Sponsored projects showed a steady increase, with 57 projects sanctioned for July 2024 – June 2025. Notable projects include solar hydrogen production (₹11.9 million) and drug-resistant cancer treatment (₹8.74 million).
Total project costs sanctioned range from ₹4.92 million to ₹11.9 million across various funding agencies.
- (e) Patent: Total patents filed: 2,445; patents granted: 432; copyrights filed: 710. Significant growth in patent filings over the years, with 184 patents filed in the current year.
- (f) Research Publications- Total publications reached 4,571, with a significant number of Scopus-indexed papers. Research output shows a consistent increase over the years, with a target of 4,315 for the next academic year.
- (g) Total consultancy amount: ₹914.10 lacs, with various organizations engaged for training and consultancy services.
- (h) MOUs- The University signed 11 MOUs with organizations like Hockey India and international universities to enhance research and education.
- (i) Conference and Workshops – 35 + conferences and workshops were organized, including the TiE Young Entrepreneurs and International Conference on Millets

B. ANNUAL ACADEMIC PLANNING 2025-2026

1. Curricular Aspects Planning 2025-2026

Curriculum planning is the first step towards annual planning as the resources and infrastructure, and teaching learning requirements are planned as per the curriculum aspect. It ensures that teaching and learning are purposeful, systematic, and aligned with the Vision, Mission and Core Values of the University apart from various regulatory and statutory body requirements.

Dr S K Khatri, Addl. Pro Vice Chancellor and Dean (Academics) gave the presentation on Curriculum Planning for 2025-2026.

Curricular Aspects Planning for 2025-26:

- (a) To implement uniformity of 4 Credit Unit (CU) courses in programmes of Engineering & Technology Domain.

- (i) To develop a system for 4 years Hons/Hons. with Research based on the CCFUP guidelines to provide their preference during the 6th Semester regarding opting Honours or Honours with research.
- (j) To develop and implement an online system for the NTCC Re-do cases

- (b) She gave an overview of the total number of labs in AUUP Noida, which has increased from 336 in 2021–22 to 371 in 2024–25 and further she gave an overview of the projected budget versus the approved budget for the last four years.
- (c) The approved budget has increased significantly last year from 15% (2023–24) to 44% (2024–25).
- (d) The Chairperson University IQAC enquired about the status of calibration of equipment, for which the Chairperson LEAC informed that the HoIs are responsible for maintaining the calibration of equipment.
- (e) She also gave the presentation on the component wise budget and the planning for 2024–25 and projected plan for 2025-26. C. Remarks by External members:

1. Dr Yogendra Narain: Dr Narain said that he was also part of the AIU VC Conference held in June 2025, in which the inputs from various Vice Chancellors from all over the country were taken. He wanted to know what action the university have taken on those inputs. He also said that the UP Governor also gave lots of points during his inaugural speech at the conference.

There is lot of scope of research and innovation in space science area, which is an upcoming area. The university should emphasise its research in the upcoming area for more development in space science.

The Chairperson replied to the remarks by Dr Narain and said that the inputs of the Vice Chancellors were analysed and recently a 6-day FDP was conducted keeping in view the suggestions given. The points given by the UP Governor and the VCs will be incorporated appropriately in academic and academic administrative processes of the University like curriculum, assessments, assignments, etc.

Dr W Selvamurthy said that lot of projects have been undertaken by faculty in the area of space science. Apart from two institutions already dedicated to space science, Amity Space Mission Programme has also been launched this year

2. Mr Rohan Sudan from WNS: Mr Sudan said that the university should focus more on industry interaction and collaborative activities like workshops, guest lectures, leadership talks, academia engagements and technical talks, etc. He added that his company is planning to conduct Master Class session series with 4 sections of 60-90 minutes covering various domains.

The Chairperson said that domain wise initiatives are taken by the university as per the aspirations of the students and curricular / co-curricular requirements.


The Chairperson University IQAC was directed to all the Chairpersons of the University Planning Committees to forward the revised presentations of Annual academic planning for 2025-26 after incorporation of suggestions given by the Chairperson and university IQAC members and minutes of the meeting held with their respective Domain IQACs.
