



# Minutes of 16<sup>th</sup> University IQAC Meeting 08 and 10 January 2022

Minutes of the 16<sup>th</sup> University IQAC meeting held on 08 & 10 January 2022 under the Chairpersonship of Prof (Dr) Balvinder Shukla, Chairperson University IQAC and Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, AUUP.

- 1. After ascertaining the quorum for the meeting, Dr R S Rai, Director IQAC with the permission of Chair welcomed all the members of the University IQAC.
- 2. Opening Address by the Chairperson University IQAC At the outset the Chairperson University IQAC & Vice Chancellor, AUUP welcomed University IQAC members, external members, alumni members and all those present in the meeting.
- 2.1 The Chairperson opened the meeting by highlighting the achievements of the university between October to December 2021.
- 2.2 She also informed the house that the University has been accredited by WSCUC, USA in 2016 and its re-accreditation is due in 2022. The re-accreditation process requires to prepare an Institutional Report of the university comprising data/information of all campuses. In this regard, a four-day interactive session was held by Dr. Susan Opp, Vice President, WSCUC and Staff Liaison to Amity on May 25 28, 2021 regarding the WSCUC Offsite Review (OSR) and Re-Affirmation Visit (AV).
- 2.3 The Offsite Review (OSR) is a comprehensive review of the institution (university) for reaffirmation (i.e. re-accreditation). WSCUC Team meets to evaluate the institutional report and make preliminary findings. The review expects an institutional report on 9 components specified by WASCUC. After submitting the report, the WSCUC team will visit all the campuses associated with AUUP.
- 3. Remarks by Dr W Selvamurthy, President ASTIF Dr Selvamurthy complimented IQAC & QAE for the improvement in quality, research & governance. He further thanked the Chairperson for her guidance and working for fulfilling the vision of the university in quality education. He also stated that WASC re-accreditation is very important to the university and all efforts should be done to submit the report on time.
